6. Board Reports

A. President - Harvey Miedreich (report submitted with Agenda please see below)

Meeting etiquette.

If you'd like to speak, you need to type next into the chat box. We need everyone to have cameras on, we're community and we cannot build community without seeing one another. It's critical. Guests will be expected to do the same.

This month I have been working towards laying groundwork for our future. As we transition away from playgrounds now that they are all funded it's very important that as we are able to take on larger projects ourselves that we have a solid foundation. I have worked with the SMS playground group to try to have a special meeting which ultimately failed. We did not harness enough responses from the board in order to achieve quorum. We continue to struggle to get board members to respond to emails within the agreed upon three days.

As we near the end of strategic planning, we will have clear goals we can work on. However, without board involvement we'll not be able to complete or even realistically begin our goals. It is time to reflect on positions on the board and scale back where possible. We have unfilled positions and have for a long time. It's hard to recruit during COVID times but especially hard when we've shut down our best way to reach the most amount of community league members. The Facebook group.

Funding Requests

We need funding requests in formal request. We can't have people show up and ask for \$15 000 and need a decision in 15 minutes. We need time to properly consider the requests as a board, it is responsible, accountable, careful decision need to be made so we can add the most value to our community league.

Reports

- We need directors to continue to submit their director reports prior to the meetings.
- We need the playground committee representative reports. (Vice President)

I do not know

I have become aware that there are many things going on in our community and even on our board but that I am unaware of almost all of them. We need more communication, who is doing what? We should all know who is doing what and how it's going, adding it to your director report is a wonderful way to keep this transparency and accountability going.

Communications

I will be stepping back into the communications role in order to have the community aware of our meetings etc. I won't be taking on content creation, this can happen when we find a suitable candidate. Summerside emails are part of this, I am slowly decommissioning them with the help of google. You may have received emails as someone trying to login to your email accounts as two factor authentication was removed so they can properly delete them. Once I have the email list back in my

hands, I will end this account. I am working with mail chimp on returning our email list to us. It's a slow process but they have been helpful thus far. We are in elevated status awaiting a reply. I expect a reply before the end of the month.

Social Media

We need to also scale back here. We have too many social media channels. I believe we should be utilizing our email list, facebook page, facebook group (Managed differently than in the past) and the website. Comunibee should be ended. The idea that we left facebook where we had 4500 active members for comunibee for hundreds of users was a misstep.

Summer plans

- What are we doing for summer? Bike school? Community garden? Skate park?
 Basketball nets in parking lots?
- Donna is concerned that strategic planning needs to be done for budget to be made. No communications and no access to memberships
- Robyn suggested sharing to community groups we can get the message out by utilizing the community pages. What do we want to do and what do we need to do to make it happen
- Danielle is concerned about community policing themselves during C19.
- Courtney is concerned about the leadership program using all Program funds.
 Discussion about approvals exceeding \$10,000. Details of the expense must be
 approved by "membership". Roybn is concerned about the wording on this item.
 Donna is working hard on the project and has presented all information to the board
 at previous meetings. At a prior meeting, Natasha verbally said Programs has
 \$14,000 to spend any way they see fit however, as there was no secretary at the
 time of that discussion, there was nothing recorded in the minutes.
- Courtney is concerned about no vote being done for the project.
- Danielle mentioned that the HCL has been in contravention of the bylaws since 2009 when they were written.
- Robyn would like this done properly and approach the membership.
- Concerns brought up about wanting a membership vote on the Leadership program. It was pointed out that the HCL has handed out more funding for playgrounds without a membership vote so now do we need to question the validity of the playground funding and voting.
- A request for all information on the Leadership program be provided to the board.
 It was stated that information was provided to the board at prior meetings and is recorded in the minutes.
- Spending all the budget in one place is concerning to some members
- It was pointed out that other leagues are being approached to join the Leadership program. If three leagues join the cost will be lowered and if three leagues join there is a grant available to further offset the cost. In combination, all leagues and a grant will substantially lower the cost of the Leadership program to below \$10.000.
- Sumemrside wrote the bylaws (not EFCL), if the board can't understand the HCL bylaws the bylaws need to be rewritten.
- Harvey wants to put in place policies and then do by-law amendments.
- Garage sale? Can it return?
- Green shack uncertain due to C19 restrictions and outdoor gatherings
- Garage Sales are good to go provided households following C19 restrictions
- not sure how summer will look with restriction and AHS compliance
- Skateboard park equipment is not accessible this year as there is only one set up in

the City and it's booked.

- Pop Up Garden will be based on eligibility with the City and City approval to move forward
- Larger scale events are unknown
- Memberships

How are we supporting Dhurba?

- who in the neighbouring league could help us
- EFCL mentorship programs to help Melanie will throw it in the chat. Joanne Booth is the leader on Membership for the EFCL and the EFCL has membership resources to help Dhruba.
- Harvey will connect with Dhruba and figure out memberships.

Moving forward

Right now I would say we are in some down time, parks are funded, strategic planning is not yet completed. It's time for reflection, what do we want? How do we determine where it goes?

A question I will ask each of you. If there was a community league building project started, where does it go?

Activity this past month:

- Continued working with Melanie Gizowski on the Strategic Planning meeting as well as obtaining further information on school playground builds and the role of the Community League with those types of builds.
- Continued communications with the EFCL Governance Director regarding

motions at meetings as well as discussed conflict of interest and "perceived conflict of interest' concerns.

- Located and made contact with the Membership director.
 - Determined he did not have correct email information for the HCL and brought him on-board with the correct contact information.
 - Emailed him a copy of the by-laws and orientation paperwork.
 - Worked with the President to provide the Membership director access to the HCL email and drives.
- Reached out to the AMA Registries and obtained a copy of the HCL Corporate Non-Profit Status and a copy of the official name change from SCL to HCL.
 - o Both documents are now on the HCL google drives.
 - Submitted an expense report to the Treasurer and President to approve reimbursement for the cost of both reports.
- Due to Covid 19, the Government office in charge of Non-profit organizations is closed to the public so the 2019 Annual Report was mailed to the City of Edmonton
 - Saved a PDF copy on the HCL Google Drive
 - ACTION ITEM: we still must submit an audited copy of the 2020 Annual Report which is overdue and will affect any funding/grant requests from the HCL
- Continued to reach out to local businesses and was offered a discount to members with an active CL card from Joey's Fish and Chips on Ellerslie.
 - Emailed their offer to the HCL President for review and approval
 - Need to make the HCL community aware of this offer
- Removed the signage from Walker and Summerside Skating Rinks and cleaned up garbage/debris. Hay bales are the only things remaining on both sites.

URGENT MATTER:

<u>HCL needs to submit the 2020 audited financials</u> and update the director list per the regulations of being a non-profit organization - documents must be submitted every December.

DISCUSSION ITEMS FOR MEETING:

Communications Director

- Serious consideration should be made by the HCL to hire someone savy in social media to get the HCL on the right track while a Director is found.
- The community MUST be made aware of the monthly meetings on a regular and consistent basis to ensure community involvement and transparency
 - Havery advised meeting dates and links were added up to and including June 2021
 - Harvey advised the HCL is using too many social media platforms and we need to scale down
 - The HCL had 4500 members on Facebook and now only 300 members with Communibee

Facilities Director

- The Facilities Director position is a voting position in the 2009 SCL bylaws.
- This position needs to be filled in order to ensure amenities are built for the community (excluding playgrounds)
- CBC ran a report on the underdeveloped park in Summerside (Summerside Park2) which now makes amenities for the community a top priority

Questions for City of Edmonton NRC:

- What is involved with having garbage bins installed by the City within the HCL boundaries?
 - We need to identify the "Hot spots" for litter ie. near a park, bus shelter, walking path etc. and clearly identify it as a priority spot for garbage
 - Once identified, the city would look at adding that location to the route.
 - A number of communities have expressed concerns about specific areas.
 We need to reach out to the community to identify these "hot spots".
 - SRA also manages a number of garage cans in the area
- What is involved with having street lights installed at Summerside Park2?
 - This is a community led project
 - There is a one time utility funding for community league licensed areas
 - We need to know what exact developments are going into the park site and with the City Community Development Team, consider what this looks like
 - Public Engagement must be part of this which Candace is working on
 - There are temporary options however we need to look at the long term ramifications at the site to ensure all the utilities accommodate all amenities and areas
 - It was suggested that the gate be permanently locked for the time being however Maintenance people need regular access as does the Community for utilizing the park
 - Inquiry needs to be made with the Peace officers who handle this aspect to see what they suggest

 - o Jeff supported Donna's idea and suggested to focus on promoting individuals and families participate and submit photos of them doing the clean up
 - o Amendments made to the clean up program:
 - o Courtney amended her motion to request families submit photos and the top 3 families would win a \$100 (x3 = \$300)
 - o Suggested a hashtag be created #horizoncleanup
 - o See if the school would mention this to the students
 - o All members agreed that Donna's idea is a wonderful idea and Courtney said she will run with it. \$300 split three ways- PASSED unanimously by the board

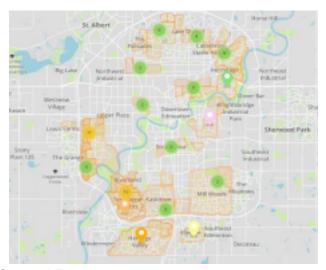
City Run Projects & Plans
